There were no public comments on this item.

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BROOK HILL ESTATES REDUCTION OF LETTER OF CREDIT

The Board received a written recommendation of the General Planning Engineer Stephen Gitch, dated January 17, 2012 for the release of \$66,000.00 from the Maintenance and Improvements Letter of Credit for Brook Hill Estates, leaving a balance of \$72,426.00 in the account. The Solicitor noted that the Developer was in arrears in another escrow and had previously authorized transfer of funds between the two accounts. She suggested withholding \$2,000.00 from the recommended release to be used to replenish the account in arrears. Upon motion by Steve Pany, seconded by Ronald J. Heintzelman, the Board authorized the release of \$64,000.000 from the Letter of Credit for Brook Hill Estates, leaving a balance of \$74,426.00. Roll call: Jerry Joseph - yes; Ronald J. - Karen Komlos, Orefield, stated we need to do what's best for the township and not worry about being competitive with other townships.
- Phil Wehr, Neffs, asked if the issue is really to promote growth or to stay within our tax base.
- Kathy Bryan, Orefield, inquired if there was proof that developers were pushed away because of our fees.
- Mark Hills, Laurys Station, stated he felt people would be willing to pay more for living in a certain area.
- John Roberts, non-resident, suggested the Manager survey the surrounding township for their fees.
- Ronald Roth, Schnecksville, asked if non-residents could make suggestions and comments.
- Dennis Komlos, Orefield, asked if township costs are being covered.

NW1/309 UTILITY PAYMENT IRONTON PHONE COMPANY

Upon motion by Jerry Joseph, seconded by Steve Pany, the Board authorized payment to the Ironton Phone Company for fees related to the NW1/309 project, to be reimbursed from the NW1/309 Utility Account funds. HEATING OIL AND UNDERGROUND TANK REMOVAL

Mr. Bartlett gave a summary on previously obtained quotes regarding the removal of an abandoned underground tank filled with heating oil. Various options were discussed. Upon motion by Steve Pany, seconded by Jerry Joseph, the Board authorized the Manager and the Solicitor to pursue the option of offering the fuel to the emergency services entities and temporarily capping the tank and to investigate costs for removing the tank. Roll call: Jerry Joseph - yes; Ronald J. Heintzelman - yes; Steve Pany - yes.

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TANK REMOVAL continued . . .

- Ricky Harring, Schnecksville, suggested emergency services should have a chance to purchase the fuel at a discount and that the funds could cover the cost of removing the tank.
- Eugene Wolfgang, Orefield, suggested having township forces excavate the tank and have a 3rd party contractor test the soil.
- Kathy Bryan, Orefield, inquired about the lowest bid for tank removal.
- Ronald Roth, Schnecksville, suggested the fire companies purchase the oil and the township keep the tank for future diesel storage. He also asked which fire company would be responsible if there was a spill.
- Blaine Bauer, Orefield, asked the age of the tank.
- Samantha Neas, Schnecksville, stated all fire companies and the ambulance should have an option to buy the oil.

WELL ISOLATION DISTANCE EXEMPTION & GROUNDWATER STUDY WAIVER REQUEST

LC Recorder of Deeds issued the township a check for \$72,288.25. The correct amount due to the township should have been \$68,788.25, based on the corrected statement of value for the property.
