



**NORTH WHITEHALL TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
NORTH WHITEHALL TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING
JULY 13, 2026**

Chairman Dennis Klusaritz called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence. In attendance, were Supervisor Al Geosits, Supervisor Richard Semmel, Township Solicitor Tom Dinkelacker, Engineer Dave Alban, Director of Operations Jeff Mouer, Director of Public Works Rick Holtzman, Director of Finance Seth O'Neill, Fire Code Administrator Jim Steward and Secretary/Deputy Treasurer Jessica Koenig.

This meeting is being recorded. Upon approval of the minutes by the Board of Supervisors the electronic recording file will be destroyed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. An executive session was held at 6:00 p.m. prior to the regular meeting to discuss several litigation and potential litigation matters, including the Trammell Crow Warehouse, Woodside Mobile Home Park, the Weierbach Curative Amendment and Zoning Hearing Board Appeals, the Bodamer/Haynes Zoning Hearing Board appeal regarding a dog grooming business, and a potential personal injury claim by Rebecca Newsom involving an incident at a Township park. Staff also sought legal advice regarding the validity of a 1993 Recreation Fee and Open Space Agreement. Supervisor Klusaritz recused himself and did not participate in the portion of the executive session during which the Weierbach Curative Amendment was discussed.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

Upon motion by Supervisor Klusaritz, seconded by Supervisor Semmel, the minutes of the June 8, 2026, Board of Supervisors meeting were approved. Roll call: Supervisor Klusaritz - yes; Supervisor Geosits - yes; Supervisor Semmel - yes. There were no public comments on this item.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Upon motion by Supervisor Klusaritz, seconded by Supervisor Semmel, the June 2026 treasurer's report and checks # 21394 – 21495 were approved as presented. Roll call: Supervisor Klusaritz - yes; Supervisor Geosits - yes; Supervisor Semmel - yes. There were no public comments on this item.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Supervisor Klusaritz recessed the regular meeting and turned the proceedings over to Attorney Dinkelacker regarding a scheduled Street Light Tax Appeal for the properties at 3367 Greenleaf Street and 3342 Greenleaf Street, owned by the Heintzelman Trust. Attorney Dinkelacker advised the Board that no public hearing could be conducted because the appellant was not present. No public hearing was held. As a courtesy, the Township advised that the property owner/trustee may appear at a future Board of Supervisors meeting to be heard on the appeal.

IRT CONNECTION RFP

AUTHORIZATION TO ADVERTISE

Upon motion by Supervisor Klusaritz, seconded by Supervisor Geosits, the Board authorized Township staff to advertise Ironton Rail Trail Loop & Connection Feasibility Study RFP. This study will look at options for creating a new loop section along the IRT and will also expand upon the recently completed LTAP study to look at possible options for connecting the IRT to Levans Park. **AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE SUCCESSFUL COMMUNICATION TRAINING SESSION

VIEWS AT FELLS CREEK

FINANCIAL SECURITY RELEASE # 3

Upon motion by Supervisor Geosits, seconded by Supervisor Semmel, the Board accepted the written recommendation of the general planning engineer dated July 1, 2026, to reduce the Views at Fells Creek line of credit in the amount of \$1,183,430.45. The balance remaining in the line of credit after this reduction is \$637,060.08. Roll call: Supervisor Klusaritz - yes; Supervisor Geosits - yes; Supervisor Semmel - yes. There were no public comments on this item.

GREENLEAF ESTATES

FINANCIAL SECURITY RELEASE # 4

Upon motion by Supervisor Geosits, seconded by Supervisor Semmel, the Board accepted the written recommendation of the general planning engineer dated July 7, 2026, to reduce the Greenleaf Estates line of credit in the amount of \$160,112.87. The remaining financial security balance is \$700,008.84. Roll call: Supervisor Klusaritz - yes; Supervisor Geosits - yes; Supervisor Semmel - yes. There were no public comments on this item.

RIDINGS AT PARKLAND PHASE II

FINANCIAL SECURITY RELEASE # 1

Upon motion by Supervisor Geosits, seconded by Supervisor Klusaritz, the Board accepted the written recommendation of the general planning engineer dated July 7, 2026, to reduce the Ridings at Parkland line of credit in the amount of \$588,755.78. The remaining financial security balance is \$1,811,156.51. Roll call: Supervisor Klusaritz - yes; Supervisor Geosits - yes; Supervisor Semmel - yes. There were no public comments on this item.

- **3917 Buchanan Street** – A few years ago, the township was able to get a court order to remove this blighted property. Over the course of the process, the property incurred a lien amount of \$34,491.78. The Township was able to recently collect that lien in full. This project is now complete after nearly 7 years.
- **Neffs valley Park** – Neffs Valley Park will be closed to the public starting on Monday, July 20 for Phase 1 of the long-awaited improvements. Phase 1 will include removal of the existing parking area, a new parking area off Park Valley Road, additional ADA compliant walking trails, evergreen screening, native tree plantings and landscaping throughout. The park is anticipated to be closed for 2-3 months until construction is complete.
- **Summer Concert** – Steel Creek will be performing at the Schnecksville Fair band stage this Friday, July 17 at 6:00 PM. Food and beverages will be available for purchase.
- **Goat on the Loose!** – On Sunday, July 12, I received a phone call for Lt. Troutman of PSP with what may be the most unusual law enforcement update of the year. Troopers in the area successfully apprehended a goat that was running at large on Old Post Road and causing a bit of excitement. After allegedly refusing to identify itself, the goat was read its rights and taken into protective custody. The goat quickly became a local celebrity on the Township Facebook page and now holds the all-time record for our most-liked social media post, generating more than 1,300 interactions. We can only assume the goat is currently seeking representation and negotiating a settlement. No bail was required.
